Do you have an entrepreneurial mind-set with a prototype or minimum viable product (MVP) in the healthcare field? Join us to validate your prototype or MVP in the market, enhance your knowledge and extend your professional network in the InnoStars Awards programme!

- 25.000 € smart money¹ or mentoring with 4.000 € value²
- mentoring (individual mentoring for four months)
- trainings (two physical bootcamps throughout Europe)

Is it for me? Eligible applicants and projects

InnoStars Awards programme is suitable for micro and small enterprises (according to EU SME definition), spin-offs and start-ups that already have a prototype or a MVP, but product/service is not on the market yet (no income). The company must be incorporated/registered before the sub-granting agreement initiation.

Additional eligibility criteria are:

- All documents must be delivered and oral pitch should be presented in advanced level English
- Applicants must be available to spend at least 15 days for educational and mentoring purposes.
- o Participation in bootcamps and mentoring sessions are obligatory for a stable team (same team members should be involved on the bootcamps and mentoring sessions).
- Start-ups should be willing and capable to travel to other European locations during the training and mentoring.
- Submitted through EIT Health InnoStars registration platform, Optimy.
 Incomplete submissions, late submissions, or submissions via any other routes (e.g., email) will not be accepted.
- o Applicants can apply only with legal entities from the following countries: Croatia, Czech Republic, Slovenia, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Lithuania, Latvia, Estonia, Spain, Cyprus, Malta, North Macedonia, Montenegro, Serbia, Bulgaria. Ukraine, Turkey
- o Companies who received grant for the same project/service/product in 2019, 2020 or 2021 from InnoStars Awards, European Health Catapult, or Startups Meet Pharma funding are not eligible to apply for InnoStars Awards in 2023.
- o Applicants cannot apply parallel for RIS Innovation Call or European Health Catapult funding in 2023.

In order to be eligible, proposals must contain all the required information, be completed via the online form and be received by the deadline 16th April, 2023, 23:59 (CET). Late or incomplete submissions, or submissions via any other routes (e.g., email) will not be accepted.





Program elements and selection process

InnoStars Awards offers a 2-stage program structure where both stages offer challenges, opportunities and valuable prizes for the best performing applicants.

Stage 1 - NAM selection (only for startups with active aging focus)

Startups will be selected that fit the overall EIT Health and NAM Health Longevity Grand Challenge objectives, with no further financial support. Selected companies will be eligible to compete for the second tier (Accelerator Awards) of the NAM Grand Challenge, and receive educational and networking support.

Stage 2 – Mentoring and Training

After the completion of "Mentoring and Training" part, submit your business plan by 30th September and potentially qualify for the final pitch of InnoStars Awards.³

Stage 3 – InnoStars pitch

Pitch your business plan to an international jury consisting of healthcare professionals, representatives of EIT Health core industrial partners and market experts. Win up to 25 000 €⁴ to launch your product or service, to find first customers and to get in connection with EIT Health Partners from all over Europe. Present your success story in the local and European media.

Practical issues

The following rules will be applied for all applicants and winners of InnoStars Awards:

- The language of the competition is English.
- Selection criteria:
 - Well-defined prototype or MVP
 - o Fit with EIT Health strategic objectives
 - Novelty and feasibility of the approach
 - o Value proposition
 - o Potential market impact of the product/service
 - o Qualified team with the capacity to bring the innovation to market
 - o Impact of the opportunity in the local InnoStars Region
- Winners will sign a grant agreement with EIT Health InnoStars. Only established legal entities can sign the grant agreement.
- The purpose of the programme is to accelerate market entry and create new economic activity therefore applications to support research will be rejected.
- Clear IP and IP protection strategy needs to reported
- Exit or growth strategy needs to be presented





Submit your application by 16th April 2023.
